Your Room-by-Room Home Safety Checklist

Living Room & Common Areas

Tripping Hazards:

- Clear clutter, cords, and small furniture from pathways.
- Secure or remove rugs with non-slip backing. Lighting:
- Solution Ensure rooms are well-lit with easily accessible light switches.
- Add motion-sensor or plug-in nightlights. Furniture Placement:
- Arrange furniture to allow wide pathways for walking aids.
- Avoid sharp-edged tables; use corner protectors.

Bathroom

Grab Bars:

- Install grab bars near the toilet, shower, and bathtub. Non-Slip Surfaces:
- Place non-slip mats in the shower, bathtub, and bathroom floor. Accessible Fixtures:
- Use a raised toilet seat and a handheld showerhead.
- Provide a shower chair or bench for stability.
- Storage:
- Keep toiletries and towels within easy reach to prevent overreaching.

Kitchen

Accessible Storage:

- Store frequently used items on lower shelves or countertops. Appliance Safety:
- Use appliances with automatic shut-off features, like kettles or stoves. Spill Prevention:
- Clean spills immediately and use non-slip mats near sinks. Fire Safety:
- Keep a fire extinguisher easily accessible.

<u>Bedroom</u>

Bed Accessibility:

- Ensure the bed is at a safe and comfortable height. Lighting:
- Place a lamp or light switch within reach of the bed or a motion detector nightlight. Emergency Items:
- ✓ Keep a phone, glasses and medical alert device on the bedside table.

Hallways & Staircases

Lighting:

- Install motion-sensor lights or additional fixtures for staircases. Handrails:
- Securely install handrails on both sides of staircases. Non-Slip Steps:
- Add non-slip treads or brightly colored tape to highlight steps.

Medication Safety (All Areas)

Pill Organizers:

- Use a weekly or monthly organizer to manage doses. Labeling:
- Clearly label medications and use large-print instructions. Proper Storage:
- Store medications in a cool, dry place, out of reach of children or pets. Safe Disposal:
- Oispose of expired or unused medications at a pharmacy.

Emergency Preparedness

Medical Alert System:

- Provide a wearable device for emergencies.

 Contact Information:
- Post emergency numbers in visible areas, such as near phones. Fire and Carbon Monoxide Safety:
- igotimes Install and test smoke and carbon monoxide detectors regularly.
